Introductory Thought The biblical account of Christmas is unique in more ways than one. Where else in human history can we find as remarkable an example of worldwide solidarity? The groups that welcomed Jesus' birth cut across all manner of divisions. Angelic hosts and earthly pilgrims, regal scholars and lowly shepherds, rulers and nobodies, kinsfolk and strangers all rejoiced in his coming. The Incarnation fulfilled the shared dreams of all humankind

Reading I Numbers 6:22-27 Numbers is the fourth book of the Pentateuch. Thirty-nine chapters consist of laws, narratives, and poems that cover Israel's forty years of desert wandering. Special emphasis was given to the beginning and end of this period. The commanding personality of Moses is apparent everywhere in Numbers.

Reading II Galatians 4:4-7 Paul has been treating the subjects of the law, on one hand, and of faith on the other. When the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law. This was so that those who had lived under the law might live as children of God

Reading III Luke 2:16-21 From the beginning, the Christian faith has been a world religion. Foreigners from different lands and religions paid homage to the new-born child who was destined to become the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. The same outsiders who were welcome at his manger are welcome in his kingdom

CLOSING THOUGHT The greatest threat to our survival as nations and as a species is probably the tribal mentality that builds walls between friends and enemies, between believers and unbelievers. At the deepest levels of our existence we are all united. We are all part of the one family of God. The differences between us are overshadowed and ultimately undermined by the things we share in common. Remember, ultimately we are one in Christ the Lord
