New Building Fund Raising Committee Meeting Monday 8th 6:30pm in the Parish Center Kitchen. Come join us! 5th Sunday in O T - B: February 7th: In today's readings we have seen that Jesus made all things new when he came and suffered, died, and rose for us. He brings deep meaning to our suffering, and ultimately desired to heal us of all of our sin and brokenness. He comes into each of our lives to heal us and raise us to new life in him.

Prayer: Let's reflect on these words from the Gospel reading from today. Call to mind the scene of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Take a word that comes to mind and reflect for a moment on what it means to you personally. For example, you might have been attracted to the words, "He approached." How can you allow him to approach you in the places you desire healing?
